10 Foot Quilt



Finished Size 56 x 56

This project is a learning quilt. It uses 10 vintage feet, however this can all be done on a modern machine if desired. For detailed block by block instructions, please visit <u>www.blockingclever.com</u>. The unadorned version of this pattern, "Barefoot", is also available.

Fabric A:

(4) 3" x 16.5"

(8) 2.5" x 8.5"

Fabric C:

(8) 2" x 16.5"

Fabric D:

(8) 2.5 x 24.5"

Fabric E:

(4) 4.5" x 32.5"

Fabric F:

(4) 4.5 x 40.5

Fabric G:

(4) 7" x 48.5"

Fabric H:

(6) 1.5" x WOF (6) 2.5 x WOF

(4) 9.5" #3 Coil Zipper tape


(4) 24.5" ribbon (or insertion lace if available)

Optional Flower: (1) 1" x WOF Fabric H (1) 2.5" x WOF Fabric A

Layout

Notes:

Borders are counted from center block out. The accent (blue) in border 1 is zipper tape Accent in border 2 is white with buttons Accent in border 3 is Ribbon



Piece

Border 1:

Foot: Zipper foot

Use the zipper foot to sew strips of fabric B to sides of Zipper tape. Add zipper pulls. Trim blocks to 8.5" x 4.5". Repeat for a total of 4 blocks.

Border 2:

Feet: Standard foot, Button Hole attachment

Side 1: Sew a 2.5" strip fabric A to a 2" strip fabric C. Press seam to dark. Repeat for 3 more times, set aside.

Side 2: Sew a 3" strip fabric A to a 2" strip fabric C. Fold fabric A in half over itself and press. Then open the seam and press to the light side, keeping fabric A folded and excess tucked behind the seam. This creates the double layer for the placket.

Evenly sew button holes on side 2 in the proper size for your buttons. Nest side 1 under side 2 just like the front of a shirt and sew and top stitch together down the seam on side 2. Trim blocks to $16.5^{\circ} \times 4.5^{\circ}$ Repeat for a total of 4 blocks.

Border 3:

Foot: Edge stitcher

Press under $\frac{1}{4}$ inch on one side of each strip fabric D. Use edge stitch foot to join pressed side to ribbon, taking care to keep the top of the blocks even. Trim blocks to 24.5" x 4.5" Repeat for a total of 4 blocks.

Border 4:

Foot: Narrow hem, Shirring (gathering)

Trim selvage from 1.5" strips fabric H. Cut two strips in half and pair each with an uncut strip. Join along short side with 1/4 inch reinforced seam to create a 1.5×66 " inch strip.Use the narrow hem foot to create a rolled hem down each side, and the shirring foot to create a gathered ruffle down length. Sew a ruffle strip down center of each strip of fabric E. Trim blocks to 32.5" x 4.5" Repeat for a total of 4 blocks.

Border 5:

Foot: Adjustable Hem, Ruffler

Join the 2.5" strips fabric H in the same manner as border 4. Use the adjustable hemmer to create a $\frac{1}{2}$ inch hem down length. Use the ruffler to create a pleated ruffle on raw edge down length. Sew ruffle right side up to each strip fabric F. Trim blocks to 40.5" x 4.5" Repeat for a total of 4 blocks.

Border 6:

Foot: PinTuck

Use pintuck foot to even space 5 tucks down length of strips fabric G. Trim blocks to 48.5" x 4.5" Repeat for a total of 4 blocks.

Optional Flower:

Foot: Binder

Use the binder to attach the 1" strip fabric H to 2.5" strip fabric A. Twist into a flower and use a button to secure to the finished quilt.

Assemble:

Use the 8.5" square fabric A as the center point, and join borders as with a standard 9 patch construction using the 4.5" squares fabric a for the corners. For alternate assembly method for more precise joins, please see <u>http://blockingclever.com/10-foot-quilt-top/</u>.

Bind as desired, quilt and add buttons to border 2.
